Thinking about a quotation from Jean-Luc Godard:


« We must make movies like a farmer makes his own organic vegetables and sells them to the market ». An investigation was necessary. Therefore, I went to see my brother, organic farmer in the South of France.

So what would be organic filmmaking?

PRODUCTION

Small fish (*petits poissons* in the original french title) is a reflexive and philosophical documentary with a little sens of humor. Following its premiere in september 2019, it has been selected in several festivals around the world and won some awards.

The film started off in a workshop about documentary film making and became in March 2020 the 1st Objectif Lune project, a company for independant productions dealing with social and engaged themes.





DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Today we are surounded by screens and images, everywhere. The screen has became a second nature of our lives. I watch films, a lot less than when I was younger but still and always chose them deliberatelly. Jean-Luc Godard is part of my culture. If you are interested in cinema, you can't miss him out.

So when I read his quotation, I instantly thought of my brother. We have a strong relation and I felt I could link his mission as an organic farmer to mine: comparing filmmaking to vegetable production. The mise en scene of the film is intended to go into a philosophical and humoristic direction, because the purpose has nothing to do with a instructional video, I stayed in a questionning narration.

For those who like to watch or to make films, small fish is dedicated to them.
